The INCTR is dedicated to helping to build capacity for cancer treatment and research in countries in which such capacity is presently limited, and thereby to create a foundation on which to build strategies designed to lessen the suffering, limit the number of lives lost, and promote the highest quality of life for children and adults with cancer in these countries, and to increase the quantity and quality of cancer research throughout the world.

INCTR Programs

Clinical Research

INCTR develops clinical research projects through its Strategy Groups. Projects are conducted through surveys, early detection and treatment studies. With an emphasis on curable or preventable cancers and cancers that affect women and children, ongoing INCTR projects encompass Burkitt lymphoma, leukemia, NPC, retinoblastoma, Wilms' tumor, breast and cervical cancer.

Palliative Care Access (PAX)

INCTR established PAX to address the challenges related to the delivery of palliative care in developing countries where such care can be hindered by limited access to opioids and other symptom-relieving medications, competing health priorities, and limited access to health services. INCTR's PAX program assists developing countries to initiate and sustain locally relevant palliative care.

Foundational Programs

INCTR has developed a set of foundational programs which are designed to build capacity and improve cancer control. These programs include: focused workshops, cataloging and reviewing evidence for cancer control within developing countries, developing human resources via partnerships, and engaging with local community health centers.

Pediatric Oncology

INCTR established its Pediatric Oncology Program to improve all aspects of care for children with cancer – diagnosis, treatment, supportive care for both immediate and late effects of treatment, and palliative care.

Pathology

The Pathology Program is aimed at improving or building pathology services through the evaluation of existing infrastructure and expertise, on-site review of diagnostic materials and through the introduction of modern techniques, consultation and continuing education using web-based technologies.

Open Health Systems Laboratory

With the use of IT, INCTR is developing and making available web-based educational materials and applications relevant to the needs of health care providers in low and middle income countries.

INCTR Biennial Meeting

The INCTR Meeting is an important event that brings together INCTR associate members from many different countries to strengthen international collaboration in all aspects of cancer treatment and research, to report progress made related to INCTR programs, and to identify focal points through discussion that may lead to the development of new projects.

Through its awards, INCTR inspires young investigators and health care professionals by recognizing outstanding contributions to cancer treatment or research in countries with limited resources.

International Network for Cancer Treatment and Research

INCTR is a not-for-profit organization that emphasizes long-term collaboration with institutions in countries with limited resources throughout the world in order to decrease the incidence of cancer and improve treatment, including palliative care. It focuses on building sustainable capacity for creating locally relevant evidence to improve cancer control.

Organizational Structure

Located in Brussels, Belgium, the INCTR has several branches and offices, numerous associate members – individual, corporate and institutional – and partner institutions around the globe that participate in its programs.
